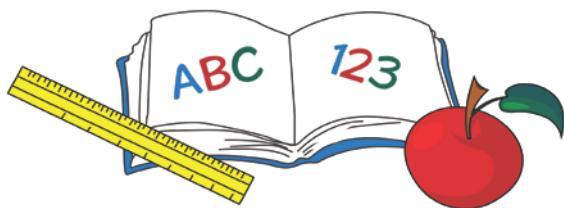




Teaching Grades 1 - 5 PROGRAM



Thank you for your interest in the Associate of Science in Teaching for Grades 1 through 5 degree program at Delgado Community College!

The Associate of Science in Teaching is comprised of 54 hours of rigorous general education coursework and 6 hours of teacher education courses. The general education classes have been specially selected to provide graduates with the specialized knowledge in mathematics, language arts, science, and social studies required to teach grades 1 through 5 in the state of Louisiana. The teacher education courses are designed to expose students to a variety of classroom situations through observation, mentoring, guided discovery, and working with students in supervised, small group situations. The program is designed to provide a seamless transition to Louisiana baccalaureate Colleges of Education.

Attached to this e-mail message, you will find a description of the degree program including the requirements for entering the program and for successfully completing the degree. Also, the curriculum outline and course descriptions are included for your review; all information is from the current Delgado Community College Catalog. To apply for the Associate of Science in Teaching for Grades 1 through 5 degree program, you must first apply for admission to Delgado Community College if you have not done so already. You may complete your application on-line by visiting the Delgado website and choosing "Future Students." You may also complete an application in person at the Office of Admissions at any Delgado Community College location. When applying, remember to select "Teaching, Grades 1-5" as your preferred major.

The Associate of Science in Teaching is a limited admissions program; therefore, a separate application process is required. A description of the entrance requirements is included in the information from the College Catalog attached to this letter, as is an application to the program.

The Associate of Science in Teaching (A.S.T.) for Grades 1-5 is a transfer degree program that addresses the requirements of the Baccalaureate of Science in Elementary Education offered by the public and private colleges of education in Louisiana. The mission of the A.S.T. program is to provide the highest quality foundational coursework specifically designed to produce teacher candidates for the state universities and colleges of education who are effective communicators with knowledge, skills, and dispositions to meet the diverse education needs of Louisiana schools and their students. It is the design of the A.S.T. degree to be a viable pipeline to four year colleges of education which will add to the state pool of highly qualified teachers.

The Delgado program has additional admission criteria. Prospective students must contact the Arts & Humanities Division after enrolling at the College to initiate the application procedure to the Associate of Science in Teaching program for Grades 1-5. Students who placed into developmental coursework must have completed all but one developmental course by the date of acceptance. All applications are reviewed and evaluated by the committee on admission to the A.S.T. program. The committee selects qualified individuals with potential for contributions to the profession.

To be eligible to apply to the Associate of Science in Teaching program, students must meet the following criteria:

- Possess a high school diploma or equivalent.
- Earned a minimum cumulative GPA for any college coursework completed as follows:
 - 2.0 GPA for 0-15 credit hours
 - 2.20 GPA for 16-30 credit hours
 - 2.50 GPA for 31-45 credit hours
- Display desired disposition through an interview process.
- Pass a criminal background check.

For successful completion of the program, students must achieve the following:

- Possess a minimum overall GPA of 2.5
- Pass PRAXIS I (PPST Pre-Professional Skills Test) or possess an ACT composite score of 22 or an SAT combined Verbal and Math score of 1030
- Complete successfully a collaborative interview with the receiving institution's and Delgado's interview committee
- Pass PRAXIS II Section 0014 (Elementary Education Content Knowledge)
- Complete a reflective portfolio that consists of artifacts formulated within the A.S.T. experience to be assessed and expanded by receiving four-year partnering colleges of education
