

SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS (SAP) FOR STUDENTS ON AN ACADEMIC PLAN WORKSHEET

This worksheet should be used after reviewing final grades and will explain the SAP policy and help you know if you are at risk of losing your Pell Grant, Loans and Work Study.

Students whose appeal is granted and placed on an Academic Plan will continue on that plan as long as they maintain a 2.25 semester GPA and complete each additional semester with 75% pace.

1. Pull up your Academic Transcript in LoLA, and go to the part that says “*Transcript Totals (Undergraduate).*” Then, look at the line that says “*Current Term*” *under most recent semester.*
2. Use the **chart below** to record your Current Term Attempted Hours, Earned Hours and GPA.

Part 1 of SAP—Minimum Semester GPA for students on an academic plan

1. The Current Term *GPA* you must have to continue receiving financial aid is a 2.25.
2. Is your Current Term *GPA* **lower than** the Current *Overall GPA*? **Circle Yes or No**
3. If **yes**, then you are **not** meeting the SAP policy to keep your financial aid.

Part 2 of SAP—Hours Attempted vs. Hours Earned

1. Multiply your Current Term *Attempted Hours* times 0.75 for students on an academic plan. Your answer is the *Current Term Earned Hours* you need in order to continue receiving financial aid.

$$\text{Current Term Attempted Hours} \quad _ \quad \times \quad 0.75 \quad = \quad _ \quad (\text{Current Term Earned Hours})$$

2. Is your Current Term *Earned Hours* **lower than** your answer to question #1? **Yes or No**
3. If **yes**, then you are **not** meeting the SAP policy to keep your financial aid.
