



DELGADO AND SUNO SIGN "2+2" ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOR THREE PROGRAMS

On Wednesday, May 6, 2009, Delgado Community College and Southern University at New Orleans (SUNO) held a press conference at SUNO's Pontchartrain Park campus to celebrate the reaffirmation of an agreement in good faith for the two institutions to continue to strive to create articulation agreements to benefit students seeking to start their educations at Delgado and continue on to pursue advanced degrees at SUNO.

Most important, the chancellors of these two institutions joined to sign a new "2+2" articulation agreement to insure a smooth transition beginning this fall for graduates of Delgado associate degree programs in Mathematics, Biology and Criminal Justice to junior-year status in corresponding bachelor degree programs at SUNO.

A similar "2+2" agreement for Delgado Care and Development of Young Children associate degree earners to transfer full credits to SUNO's related baccalaureate program is also currently in development.

To encourage students to make the move to SUNO, financial aid will be available for the top graduate in one of the three Delgado programs. These students will also be eligible to live in SUNO's dormitory, which is scheduled to open in January 2010.
