Deborah Lea Named Interim Chancellor as Dr. Johnson Takes New Post in Pennsylvania

In March, 2008, Delgado Community College bid farewell to **Dr. Alex Johnson** with heartfelt gratitude and admiration for all he has done for the college and the community as chancellor, and with best wishes for his continued success as president of the Community College of Allegheny County (CCAC) in Greater Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Johnson, who assumed the Delgado chancellorship on Feb. 2, 2004, will bring his expertise to CCAC's four campuses and six centers, which enroll nearly 70,000 students in credit and non-credit programs.

"Dr. Johnson has been a true leader for both Delgado Community College and the city of New Orleans," said Louisiana Community and Technical College System (LCTCS) Board of Supervisors **Chair Brett Mellington**. "His commitment to the recovery efforts of Delgado since Hurricane Katrina along with

his dedication to the overall growth and development of the institution and the LCTCS are to be commended. We are grateful for all of his hard work, and we will miss his leadership."

"We appreciate and thank Dr. Johnson for his years of service and valuable contributions to Delgado Community College," said LCTCS *President* **Dr. Joe D. May**. "Dr. Johnson has led the institution with a level of integrity and pride during one of the college's most important periods of transformation. He has done an exceptional job serving Delgado and our state, and he will be missed. We wish him and his family the best on their move."

Johnson is credited with advancing the programs and services at Delgado, realizing record-breaking pre-Katrina credit enrollment of 17,400, and leading the college during Hurricane Katrina recovery to current enrollment of 13,200 students. He also increased the college's capabilities to raise private funds, expanded regional workforce development initiatives, enhanced public awareness of the institution, and guided a formal linkage between Delgado and the Louisiana Technical College Region One technical campuses. He additionally led the college through the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools reaffirmation of accreditation process.

Following Hurricane Katrina, Johnson contributed his expertise to the recovery of New Orleans as a member of Mayor C. Ray Nagin's "Bring New Orleans Back

Commission" steering committees on education and economic development, chairing its workforce subcommittee. He was selected by the New Orleans City Council as a member of the Hurricane Recovery Advisory Committee and appointed by Governor Kathleen Blanco to the Louisiana Recovery Authority (LRA) and was a "champion" with the LRA Louisiana Speaks Campaign.

Johnson's local board memberships included Junior Achievement of Greater New Orleans, PBS affiliate WYES, Kingsley House, The Policy Board of the Greater New Orleans Educational Foundation, the Greater New Orleans Biomedical Economic Development District, the New Orleans Aviation Board, and the Board of Directors and the Executive Workforce Committee, both with Greater New Orleans, Incorporated (GNO, Inc.).

Nationally, he serves on the boards of the National Campus Compact and the American Council on Education (ACE), and has been a member of ACE Commissions on Women and Effective Leadership. With the American Association of Community Colleges, he served on the Research and Minority Affairs commissions. Dr. Johnson was a board member with the Council for Adult and Experiential Learning (CAEL) and acted as a Work Group Chair with the National Articulation and Transfer Network (NATN). He was the only community

college representative on the BEST (Building Engineering and Science Talent) Blue Ribbon Panel.

The LCTCS Board of Supervisors is currently working with Delgado to manage a national search process to select the college's next chancellor. Until that person is hired, **Deborah R. Lea** is serving as Delgado's *Interim Chancellor*.

Prior to this, Lea served as vice chancellor for Learning and Student Development, director of Curriculum and Program Development, interim associate dean of Science and Math Division, Allied Health Admissions coordinator and associate professor of Radiologic Technology. She also worked at Mercy Hospital as an assistant chief technologist, student clinical supervisor and technologist.

She has served as a member of the American Society of Radiologic Technologists, a member of the Louisiana State Radiologic Technologists Board of Examiners, an Advisory Committee member for the Radiology Program at Charity Hospital in New Orleans, and an Advisory Committee member for the School of Diagnostic Ultrasound at Charity Hospital in New Orleans.

Lea has been the author of proposals for many programs at Delgado that were approved by the Louisiana State Board of Regents, Board of Trustees and/or the Louisiana Community and Technical College System.

Lea earned a Certification in Radiologic Technology from Charity Hospital School of Radiologic Technologic and an Associate Degree in Radiologic Technology from Delgado Community College. She earned a Bachelor of Science in Radiologic Technology from William Carey College and a Masters of Education Degree in Curriculum and Instruction from the University of New Orleans.

In her first Chancellor's Dialogue held at Delgado's West Bank campus on March 31, Lea commented about her commitment while serving as interim chancellor to uphold the College's goals set forth by Dr. Johnson. "Delgado Community College is committed to moving forward in these challenging times," she said. "I see our role not as one of marking time, but moving forward."

Outlining Gov. Bobby Jindal's plan to revamp workforce training through community and technical colleges, Lea expressed her views on what promises to be a bright future for the LCTCS. Because of the immediate need for skilled employees in Louisiana's workforce, Jindal wants to restructure funding, revise the role of the state's labor department and increase partnerships between the colleges and businesses to ensure that the colleges can meet this demand.

"The alignment of the goals of the LCTCS and the state governor's office has never been as strong as it is now. The focus on workforce development helps our effort to support students and the

programs they need," Lea explained.

She also pointed out that many new organizations are seeking to partner with Delgado and LTC Region I, in addition to the many already established partnerships the colleges enjoy with local businesses.

During the spring and summer, students from Delgado and LTC Region I will meet with state legislators to demonstrate the importance of the role of community and technical colleges in Southeastern Louisiana.

While keeping the lines of communication open with the state's Board of Regents, Lea remains "hopeful and optimistic" that Jindal's proposal will pass.

Lea and her husband, Scott, radiology manager at the Medical Center of Louisiana at New Orleans, have two daughters — Veronica, a health analyst for the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in Atlanta; and Andrea, a project manager for Hess Corporation in Manhattan, N.Y.

DELGADO RECEIVES CLECO CONTRIBUTION TO ST. TAMMANY EDUCATION & TRAINING

On Jan. 30 at the Delgado Northshore Covington location, Cleco Power made the first of three \$10,000 donations to Delgado Community College in support of establishing the Joseph J. Krebs Jr. Endowed Professorship for safety education and technical training for the St. Tammany area. A portion of the total \$30,000 gift, to be made over three years, will also help develop a Delgado Public Works Institute dedicated to education and workforce training that will benefit public works and companies in St. Tammany Parish.

Once fully funded, the endowment will support Delgado's Construction Technology Program, focusing on safety and technical education, as well as the creation of specialized courses to provide short-term training for surveyors.

The new Advanced Manufacturing Center of Excellence encompasses a 3,200-square-foot laboratory fully equipped with Integrated Systems Technology (IST). IST is an advanced teaching method combining hands-on skills with a strong curriculum for an outstanding learning experience. The center's complete range of offerings includes industry-based certifications, simulated and virtual training, and online multimedia access. The following courses will be taught in the center: Technical Math, Industrial Safety, Introduction to Computers, Technical Reading, Communications, Electrical, Machinist, Industrial Maintenance, Thermal and Welding.

It is projected that 10,000 skilled workers in these areas will be needed by 2009 in the region impacted by Hurricanes Katrina and Rita. The Advanced Manufacturing Center will train 100 students a year to

help meet this critical need.

The 5,000-plus-square-foot Practical Nursing (PN) and Allied Health Center of Excellence features extensive classroom and laboratory space with state-of-the-art technology and equipment. The center supports LTC Region 1 and Delgado's Charity School of Nursing as these institutions provide PN and allied health programs, including CNA, Patient Care Technician and Phlebotomy, to meet healthcare needs in the Greater New Orleans area.

Post-Katrina, nursing is one of the career areas in greatest demand; the Louisiana Health Works Commission has estimated that the state currently needs more than 2,500 licensed practical nurses. The 14-month PN program will expand to accept 80 applicants beginning in June 2008 at the new center. For more information, visit www.linktoltc.com or www.dcc.edu.
